Alabama.- State authorization to provide a program related to the preparation of teachers or other P-12 school/system personnel does not indicate eligibility for an Alabama certificate. Applicants for an Alabama certificate based on reciprocity must meet Alabama's test requirements and submit a valid, renewable professional educator certificate lisense issued by another state at the degree level, grade level, grade level, grade level, and in the teaching field or area of instructional support for which an Alabama certificate is sought and for which Alabama issues a certificate. Alaska – The Alaska Department of Education and Early Development has state history course requirements that can be completed after initial licensure. The Initial/Out-of-State teacher certificate is initially valid for one year and can be extended twice, each for an additional year, upon passing a basic competency exam for the first extension and completing 3 semester hours each of approved Alaska history coursework for the second. Arkansas – The Arkansas Division of Elementary and Secondary Education has state history course requirements that consist of at least three (3) college credit hours in Arkansas history at an accredited institution of higher education. Texas - Without a standard teaching certificate, applicants are not eligible for a review of credentials and the <u>Texas Education Agency</u> does not review transcripts, degree level or completion of program coursework, even if the applicant has already sat for exams. Individuals without a standard teaching certificate must either complete the process in their state or would be required to go through a Texas <u>Educator Preparation Program</u>.

Utah — Teacher candidates earning their teaching license in the areas of early childhood, elementary education, preschool special education, and special education will need to complete a teacher literacy preparation assessment before they are awarded their professional license. Indiana—Indianar requires out-of-state applicants to pass a content ligensure test for each content area they wish to be licensed in. Individuals may be eligible for a one-year temporary reciprocal permit, allowing them to teach while meeting Indiana's testing requirements.
