990 Special Problems in Planning, Design, and Construction

Fall, Spring, Summer. 1 to 6 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 6 credits in all enrollments for this course. R: Open only to graduate students in the School of Planning, Design, and Construction. Approval of department.

Individual study in construction management and related Built Environment areas.

991 Advanced Topics in Planning, Design, and Construction

Fall, Spring, Summer. 1 to 6 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 8 credits in all enrollments for this course. R: Open only to graduate students in the School of Planning, Design, and Construction. Approval of department.

999 Doctoral Dissertation Research

Fall, Spring, Summer of even years. 1 to 24 credits. R: Open only to doctoral students in Planning, Design and Construction major.
