201 Introduction to American Indian and Indigenous Studies

Spring. 3(3-0) SA: AL 202

Introduction to the study of American Indian and other Indigenous peoples, including issues related to culture, knowledge, language, governance, colonization, sovereignty, and ongoing revitalization efforts.

490 Independent Study

Fall, Spring, Summer. 1 to 6 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 6 credits in all enrollments for this course. R: Approval of department.

Special project, directed reading and research arranged by an undergraduate student and a faculty member in areas supplementing regular course offerings.

491 Topics in American Indian and Indigenous Studies

Spring. 3(3-0) A student may earn a maximum of 9 credits in all enrollments for this course.

An upper-level topics course, based on the expertise of the instructor, focusing on American Indian and other Indigenous peoples, including – but not limited to – issues related to culture, knowledge, language, governance, colonization, sovereignty, and ongoing revitalization efforts.

493 Internship in American Indian and Indigenous Studies

Fall, Spring, Summer. 1 to 6 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 6 credits in all enrollments for this course. RB: Acquaintance with issues relevant to working with American Indian and Indigenous communities. R: Approval of department.

Supervised pre-professional field experience in the arts and humanities working with an American Indian or Indigenous elder, community, government, organization, agency, or business.
