Each student works under faculty direction on an experimental, theoretical, or applied problem.

602 **Primary Care Ambulatory Clerkship**

Fall, Spring, Summer. 1 to 36 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 36 credits in all enrollments for this course. Interdepartmental with Family and Community Medicine and Internal Medicine and Osteopathic Medicine and Pediatrics and Psychiatry. Administered by Osteopathic Medicine.

A 24-week ambulatory care continuity experience involving 12 weeks in a multidisciplinary environment (family medicine, pediatrics, and internal medicine), 4 weeks in family medicine and 8 weeks in specialty areas (internal medicine, surgery, pediatrics, and obstetrics and gynecology). Didactic sessions are scheduled concurrently.

Core Clinical Concepts 603

Fall, Spring, Summer. 1 to 9 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 9 credits in all enrollments for this course. Interdepart-mental with Family and Community Medicine and Internal Medicine and Neurology and Ophthalmology and Osteopathic Medicine and Pediatrics and Psychiatry. Administered by Osteopathic Medicine. R: Open to graduate-professional students in the College of Osteopathic Medicine.

A 36 week didactic continuity experience.
