Fall, Spring, Summer. 6(6-0) A student may earn a maximum of 12 credits in all enrollments for this course. P: Designated score on English Language Center test R: Approval of department. SA: ESL 220  
Systematic review of English grammar. Intensive and extensive writing of English.
- 221 English Composition for Non-Native Speakers of English**  
Fall, Spring, Summer. 3(3-0) A student may earn a maximum of 6 credits in all enrollments for this course. P: Designated score on English Language Center test R: Approval of department. SA: ESL 221  
Intensive and extensive writing in English for academic purposes.
- 222 Listening and Speaking for Academic Purposes for Non-Native Speakers of English**  
Fall, Spring, Summer. 3(3-0) A student may earn a maximum of 6 credits in all enrollments for this course. P: Designated score on English Language Center test R: Approval of department. SA: ESL 222  
Improvement of oral English skills for academic purposes.
- 223 Reading for Academic Purposes for Non-Native Speakers of English**  
Fall, Spring, Summer. 3(3-0) A student may earn a maximum of 6 credits in all enrollments for this course. P: Designated score on English Language Center test R: Approval of department. SA: ESL 223  
Study of English for students needing a reading knowledge of English for academic purposes
- 291 Special Topics in Academic English**  
On Demand. 1 to 4 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 4 credits in all enrollments for this course. RB: ESL 094 R: Approval of department. SA: ESL 291  
Special topics supplementing regular course offerings.
- 451 Effective Oral Communication for International Teaching Assistants**  
Fall, Spring. 0 to 0 credits. R: Approval of department.  
Preparation for non-native speakers of English. Focuses on English pronunciation and fluency, strategies for common TA situations, and language and culture of the American classroom.
- 452 Language of the American Classroom for International Teaching Assistants**  
Fall, Spring. 0 to 0 credits. R: Approval of department.  
Preparation for non-native speakers of English. Covers pronunciation, discourse of teaching, and student/instructor interactions.

- 453 Support for In-service International Teaching Assistants**  
Fall, Spring. 0 to 0 credits. R: Approval of department.  
In-service support for non-native speakers of English. Covers language of classroom management, discourse of teaching, and student/instructor interactions. Additional language and pedagogical support concurrent with their TA assignment.
- 491 Advanced Special Topics in Academic English**  
Fall, Spring, Summer. 1 to 4 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 4 credits in all enrollments for this course. RB: ESL 094 R: Approval of department. SA: ESL 491
