On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Procedure and substantive due process, equal protection, Bill of Rights, and Freedom of Expression.

804 Antitrust Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. How courts apply basic economic principles to business practice in a wide variety of industries.

808B Corporate Finance

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Principles of accounting, valuation, and the basic financial environment of close corporations and public companies.

811E Labor and Employment Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. At-will employment relationship, terms and conditions of employment, and the application of the National Labor Relations Act as amended impacting collective bargaining units

817D Evidence and the Expert Witness

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Scientific and technical disciplines to the process of serving as an expert in a judicial proceeding.

819 Partnership Tax

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Tax issues associated with form, term, liquidation, transfer and class problems.

822 Products Liability

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Sources, development, and limitations of product liability.

835B Federal Law and Indian Tribes

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Law and policy of the United States regarding Indian Tribes and their citizens.

835D American Indian Children and the Law On Demand. 2 to 4 credits.

American Indian children and the law including the implementation, interpretation and understanding of the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA).

835E Tribal Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits.

Survey of the laws that tribes enact to govern themselves.

835G Global Perspectives on Indigenous Peoples On Demand. 2 to 4 credits.

History, development, structure, content and efficacy of international human rights laws and norms that apply to indigenous peoples.

835Q Digital Humanities

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Legal and ethical issues implicated by the digital humanities research and resource-creation, including copyright, contract/licensing, privacy and other issues.

837R Artificial Intelligence and Law On Demand 2 to 4 credits

How Artificial Intelligence (AI) interacts with law, how law and code to work together to regulate interactions among people and computers.

8375 Automated Vehicles and the Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Myriad of legal issues, including product liability, cybersecurity, privacy, insurance, criminal law and procedure, federal and state regulation, and patents. How discovery and evidentiary presentation at trial may be managed.

837U Evolutionary Analysis and Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Basic computer techniques analyzing legal texts to measure similarity, sentiment, and perhaps influence, incorporating into law practice. Elucidating the cultural evolution of the common law.

841B Domestic Violence

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Historical background of domestic violence. Understanding the nature of domestic violence, the prevention of domestic violence, and the survivor and batterer behavior.

841F Family Law: Child, Family and the State On Demand. 2 to 4 credits.

Legal issues confronting families including marriage, parenthood, balancing work, domestic violence, adoption, and artificial insemination.

841G Immigration Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Survey of United States immigration law emphasizing policy issues and issues that an attorney may encounter.

841K Juvenile Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Laws related to juvenile courts, including juvenile delinquency, child neglect, jurisdiction, waivers, arrest, pretrial and trial.

841V Perspectives on U.S. Immigration Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Immigration law and policy from a variety of perspectives, such as historical, social, public policy, economic, human rights, and legal perspectives.

841W Racial Justice-Legal and Societal Dimensions of Truth and Reconciliation

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits.

Racial justice in America, and exploring processes of truth and reconciliation that can help bring about the goals of racial healing and transformation.

848E International Environmental Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Introduction to the use of bilateral and multilateral realities and other international mechanisms.

849C Special Topics in Comparative Law

On Demand. 1 to 4 credits. A student may earn a maximum of 6 credits in all enrollments for this course.

Special topics in comparative law.

849F Comparative Free Expression

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Examination of approaches to free expression in a variety of different countries.

851F Free Speech on Campus

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Free speech principles as they apply on the collect campus and creating a program for others to learn more about the First Amendment.

865A Animal Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Survey of animal legal issues including property status, zoning and cruelty.

865B Wildlife Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Legal systems impact on wildlife.

865C Legal Issues with Energy Development and Wildlife

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits.

Emerging issues in energy law and policy relating to fish and wildlife.

866D Water Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Water rights under the riparian doctrine and the prior appropriation system.

866Q Regulating Environmental Risk

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Regulatory responses to environmental and other risks to human life and health.

879K Law and Religion

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Church/state law with special attention placed on legal doctrines under the Establishment Clause and Free Exercise Clause of the 1st Amendment.

879R Law and Interpretation

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Judicial interpretation under the constitution, statutes and common law.

891C Negotiation

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Introduction to the principles of negotiations. Multiple mock negotiations are required.

893G Consumer Law

On Demand. 2 to 4 credits. Special legal requirements for consumer transactions.
