Elementary Latin II 102

Spring. 4(4-0) P: LTN 101 Continued study of the fundamentals of vocabulary, grammar, and syntax. Translation of elementary readings.

206 Nepos and Latin Prose

Fall of even years. 3(3-0) P: LTN 102 Selected lives of Cornelius Nepos in the original Latin, with readings in other early and Republican prose authors.

Catullus and Lucretius 208

Spring of odd years. 3(3-0) P: LTN 102 Readings from Catullus's poems and from Lucretius's "De Rerum Natura" in Latin with additional readings.

211 Livy and Roman Historiography

Fall of odd years. 3(3-0) P: LTN 102 Selections from Livy's "Ab Ubre Condita" in the original Latin.

221 Virgil and Latin Poetry

221 Virgin and Latin Poetry Spring of even years. 3(3-0) P: LTN 102 Readings from Virgil's "Eclogues", "Georgics", and "Aeneid" in Latin. Additional readings from other Latin poets of the later Republic and Augustan periods.
