Intensive Beginning Portuguese

Fall. 5(5-0) Not open to students with credit in PRT 101 or PRT 102.

Development of listening, speaking, reading, writing skills, and cultural knowledge.

201 Second-Year Portuguese I

Fall. 4(4-0) P: PRT 102

Intermediate level review and development of aural comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Topics in the cultures of the Portuguesespeaking world.

Second-Year Portuguese II Spring. 4(4-0) P: PRT 201 202

Further review and development of aural comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Topics in the cultures of the Portuguese-speaking world.

250 Intensive Intermediate Portuguese

Spring. 5(5-0) P: PRT 150 or PRT 102 RB: Solid background in another Romance language Not open to students with credit in PRT 201 or PRT 202.

Continued development of listening, speaking, reading, writing skills, and cultural knowledge.

290 Independent Study
